

Banvel causes sugarbeet injury that is visually indistinguishable from phenoxy type herbicide. Banvel may have sufficient residual in the soil to reduce emergence and to injure emerging sugarbeet.

The bottom photograph is a combination of an SU herbicide which is causing the yellowing of the plant, a phenoxy herbicide which is causing the epinastic effects on the plant, and the dual symptoms may include some of the epinasty and also the general stunting of the plant.
